## District Rates For 2020

In response to increases in master meter water rates and a service fee from Denver Water, the Lakehurst Water and Sanitation District Board of Directors has voted to increase our rates in 2020. The water rate increase and the service fee hike will affect all District commercial and residential customers. The sanitary sewer rates will remain the same for 2020. New rates take effect January 1, 2020.

### WATER RATES

Monthly	2019	2020
Service Fee	\$9.07	\$9.50
Consumption/ 1,000 gallons	\$4.91	\$5.05

### SEWER RATES

Monthly	2019	2020
Sewer Service	\$22.92	\$22.92

Lakehurst Water and Sanitation District does not have a property tax and must rely on water and sewer rates for revenue. These revenues are used to purchase water and offset the operation and maintenance

expenses for over 76 miles of water mains and 68 miles of sewer mains as well as the replacement of the aging water and sewer system.

Lakehurst continues to provide services at rates that are among the lowest rates in Denver suburban areas.

## System Rehabilitation Projects Scheduled for 2020

Lakehurst's Board of Directors have included several new rehabilitation projects in the 2020 budget.

### Water and Sewer Projects for next year include:

- Replacing six, old, non-repairable fire hydrants with newer models.
- Constructing a temporary connection on the 12-inch water line on West Quincy Ave. between South Yank St. and South Youngfield St. so that Jefferson County can complete a retaining wall, which is part of the West Quincy expansion project.
- Re-lining over 3,000 feet of 24-inch, concrete sewer line and rehabilitating eight manholes at the entrance of Foothills Golf Course south to West Quincy Ave. The project will use a "no-dig" process, minimizing traffic and service disruptions.
